ReFAB

ReFAB is our way of finding meaning & delight in the age of waste. Our bespoke, multi-use products are made from designer "waste" fabrics by women from disadvantaged backgrounds. To date, we've upcycled over 700kg of fabric creating 800+ products and upskilled over 40 women and the numbers keep growing.


voxpod

VoxPod is an innovative career exploration app designed to empower young individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds, guiding them through the complex landscape of career opportunities. VoxPod steps in to help students and recent graduates who, often overwhelmed by a multitude of career choices, lack personalized guidance.

Without adequate direction, these young individuals frequently find themselves applying indiscriminately to roles that are not a good fit, leading to a disheartening cycle of rejections. VoxPod's mission is to break this cycle by providing comprehensive support at every stage of their career journey – from initial discovery and exploration, to preparation, and finally, successful application.

Our partnership with Imperial College Business School in conducting an Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) study has been a cornerstone in understanding the dynamics at play in universities and workplaces regarding social mobility. This collaborative study involved extensive interviews with 40 employers and universities, enriched by in-depth secondary research. The findings have not only affirmed VoxPod's value proposition but have also highlighted critical areas where intervention is needed to boost social mobility in the UK. The results of this study, shared with participating stakeholders, have garnered overwhelmingly positive feedback.

We are excited to announce that the first version of VoxPod is nearing completion. This milestone brings us one step closer to our goal of offering a transformative tool for career development. Soon, we will be initiating the testing phase with our partners, a significant leap towards making this vision a reality.



WriteSpace

WriteSpace is a creative writing collaboration that launched in 2021 between Westminster School, twenty platform non-fee-paying schools and us. Students from public & private schools sit together to listen, learn, and create their own work across all genres of literature.

We are excited that not only does our initial program continue but we are finalising plans to expand our partnership going into the 2024-2025 academic year.

On 10th June 2023, the fourth guest speaker session was led by Todd Gallicano. A screenwriter, film producer, and the author of the acclaimed Sam London Adventure series, Mr. Gallicano's latest script Best. Christmas. Ever. was just released on Netflix. Focused on creating the foundation of a great story, how to make great characters, and plot a story outline, his session was a huge hit amongst the students!

The 2024 spring/summer term speaker line-up looks to be just as exciting as the past years, with sessions planned for Becky Wait, Susannah Hart, and Anjana Ahuja to led discussions on creativity, poetry, and journalism respectively.

The Kartik Foundation is also now partnering with the National Theatre, with the NT joining the Sept 2024 WriteSpace session at Westminster, during which a WriteSpace sponsored New Views programme for Platform students in the 2024-2025 academic year will be promoted. New Views is a year-long in-school playwriting programme for UK students aged 14-19. A professional playwright is paired with each school, who then supports the students to write their own 30-min plays. The NT has a long history of promoting writing amongst students and we are very excited to now join them in these endeavours!

Access Interns

Access Interns is a new initiative by Variety, the Children's Charity, in collaboration with The Kartik Foundation, to help young people with disabilities access hands-on experience across a range of industries to help them gain skills, knowledge, and build confidence and self-esteem. This experience will provide pathways to employment opportunities so they can build an independent future.

So far since launching in late 2022, we have placed three interns, aged 16-17 years old, in positions with Nationwide, SPPARC Architects, and Shooting Starz.
